

Damien inspired by architecture

ARCHITECTURE and the people who live around it provide inspiration for businessman-cum-artist Damien Isaak.

After moving to Warwickshire five years ago, the 40-year-old set up his own company in Leamington, but it is only in recent months that he discovered his passion for art.

Working with a variety of media and styles, Damien says he takes inspiration and influence from observing the buildings and people around him.

Jason Humphries-Brown, of the Leamington Studio Artists, of which Damien is now a member, said: "He has become a very prolific artist and we are pleased and excited to announce the first public display of his work.
