Billy's snapshots of swinging 60s icons

NEVER before seen snaps of John Lennon and Yoko Ono taken by the celebrated ex-Fleet Street photographer Billy Zygmant will go on display in Warwickshire next week.

Other photographs of iconic figures by the Rugby snapper which have never been seen by the public before can be viewed at Gallery 150 in Leamington from Monday.

Mr Zygmant, 71, worked for national newspapers during the sixties, specialising in pop, TV and films.

He also has a banqueting suite named in his honour at the world famous Beatles Hotel – The Hard Day's Night in Liverpool – called the Zygmant Suite.

An exhibition of his work at the Rugby Art Gallery and Museum in March broke

visitor records with 1,700 passing through the doors to see his collection of photos over ten days.

He said: "The best thing about photography is it opens doors and you meet unusual people."

The exhibition runs until Friday, September 3. The gallery is open Monday to Thursday 8.30am-4pm and Friday 8.30am-3pm.
